Distance Learning Update

Student Attendance

Our daily average attendance for the month of October was 98%

Pop-Up Departments Data

Tutoring Supports Data

The Tutoring department has been supporting approximately 340 students across all grade levels. Our program is designed to support students for one hour each week on any of their coursework. We currently have 30 staff members taking on the role of 1:1 tutor for our students during distance learning. This is a unique and powerful opportunity to support our students and ensure they are getting the additional help they need. As we moved into Quarter Two, 28 students were able to exit this program as their grades and study habits show that they are managing their time effectively and excelling in their learning. Students selected for our one-on-one tutoring support include those who are in need of academic support based on their grades, those in need of support with English language development, and those in need of additional services based on their IEPs.

Translation Services Data

The Translation Services department has been working hard to ensure our hallmark of impeccable customer service and communication remain during Distance Learning. We currently have 23 GPA staff members serving on our translation team. They are on-call and ready to translate when needed to support our GPA teachers. We have fulfilled over 175 translation requests for IEP's, parent phone calls, conferences, etc. GPA's support staff continue to embody the whatever-it-takes philosophy at GPA.

Curbside Service Data

The Curbside Delivery Team has been busy distributing supplies to our students. Our team has delivered more than 400 supply bundles (including earbuds with microphones, lined paper, printer paper, pencils,

pens, highlighters, glue sticks, rulers, notebooks for each class, graph paper, colored pencils, graphing calculator [high school only]) to middle school students, more than 100 art supply boxes for high school students, 30 keyboards to high school digital piano students and project supplies for high school students. Beginning November 16, high school students will be receiving their supply bundles as well as specific supplies for individual classes.

Office of Student Affairs--First Quarter Update

Loneliness due to the pandemic is particularly tough on children. With this in mind and recognizing that many of our students' social, emotional, or mental well-being has been impacted by the pandemic, the Office of Student Affairs hosted a middle school virtual social hour on Wednesday September 30th and Thursday November 1st. The hour allowed middle school students to have healthy interactions by participating in games and facilitated discussions led by our counseling team. More virtual social hours are scheduled while we continue with distance learning.

On October 15th, our GPA counseling team in partnership with San Diego Youth Services facilitated a parent workshop on Suicide Prevention & Mental Health During COVID 19 via Zoom. The workshop was offered in both English and Spanish and discussed warning signs of suicide in addition to the mental health impact of the current COVID 19 pandemic. Parents learned about helpful strategies and approaches to address behaviors of concern and were provided with supports and resources for further assistance. Some of the parent testimony/feedback from this valuable workshop:

COVID-19 has created a perfect storm of factors that have led to a sharp increase in unreported cases of child abuse and neglect, as children are cut off from interactions with professionals, confined at home with caregivers and relatives, and families are feeling the stress of job loss and economic uncertainty. In an effort to offer support to parents who are feeling the angst and frustration of the pandemic, the Office of Student Affairs, in partnership with San Diego State University Research Foundation, offered a parent workshop on October 21st. The intent of this workshop was to begin the conversation of how to cope with frustration, create boundaries and structures to support the family and use this crisis as an opportunity to strengthen the family. Professional Development

On Tuesday, November 3, 2020, all teachers received Professional Development (PD) from our lead teacher and Superintendent, Director Riveroll. PD focused on what teachers need to do differently during quarter 2 to ensure we are meeting the needs of our students during Distance Learning. We received gratitude and positive feedback on the professional learning that took place.

"Thank you for yesterday's discussion. It is an incredible skill you have to be able to present data that seems disheartening at first blush, but we leave feeling hopeful, optimistic, and empowered. All in less than an hour!"

There were four key components of Professional Development that Director Riveroll led that are expected to be implemented school-wide during the second quarter.

- 1. The Grandparent Method
- 2. The Art of the Mini-lesson
- 3. GPA Homework Schedule
- 4. Intentional Office Hours

We are looking forward to seeing the results of the above PD implementation during Quarter 2.

WASC Self Study

The WASC visiting committee completed their virtual Self-Study visit at the beginning of October. The visiting committee was impressed with GPA overall and had many wonderful things to say in their report.

"Gompers Preparatory Academy takes the mission "accelerate academic achievement for all students through a college preparatory culture and curriculum" seriously and works with the community to continually reinforce that mission."

"The school has demonstrated consistently since their origin as a charter school, the ability to improve and grow student academic success. The GPA mission is deeply felt and seen including in data points such as attendance, student test score growth, AP access, etc."

GPA was found to be Effective or Highly Effective in 19 of the 20 WASC categories. In their Visiting Committee Report they highlighted Culture, Leadership, Instruction and Professional Development as areas of strength. The Visiting Committee gave consistent leadership in both personnel and practices as rationale for our effectiveness.

Part of the Self Study process involves determining your schools areas of growth and developing an Action Plan to address your findings. The Visiting Committee concurred that all areas of growth were addressed in our Action Plan goals below.

1. <u>College Readiness:</u> Build the essential skills of stamina, confidence, study skills, time management, organization, content mastery, critical thinking, and

work ethic to increase college readiness in all content areas through project based learning and real world experiences.

- 2. <u>Academic Achievement:</u> Increase the number of students who are meeting and exceeding the standards on state-wide assessments in ELA, Math and Science with an emphasis on interventions to increase the academic performance of students in subgroups ELL and SPED.
- 3. <u>School Culture and Climate:</u> Decrease the number of behavior infractions, discipline referrals, and suspensions school wide.
- 4. **GPA Data Analysis Protocol:** Develop a systematic process for evaluating and analyzing data to inform decision making. Routinely assess multiple forms of data to determine student needs, develop and implement strategies/interventions and assess results and impact on student success to monitor progress. Determine systems to access and utilize data from alumni to inform and enhance current practices.
- 5. **Preserving and Promoting the GPA Way:** Develop processes and protocols for defining, monitoring, preserving, and celebrating the GPA way through building a respectful, professional community including all stakeholders students, parents, teachers, staff, community, leadership and Board.

The above action plan goals will serve as a road map for the next six years as we restart the cycle of continuous improvement for our next self-study in 2026.

Parent Prep Academy/Coffee with the Director

There have been five Parent Prep Academy/ Coffee with the Director meetings since September. In an effort to keep our parents informed and engaged with GPA during Distance Learning, Director Riveroll has led these meetings. Remarkably, there are approximately 100 people in attendance to learn about the topics covered and ask any questions they may have. Topics that have been discussed include; Distance Learning Portal, Zoom, WASC, Quarter Finals, Parent Conferences, the GPA Calming Room, GPA Website, Pop-Up Departments, and Virtual Classroom Observations. Our next Parent Prep Academy/Coffee with the Director will take place on Friday, November 20, 2020 at 9:00am.

WingSpan College and Career Center Update

Our Wingspan staff have been busy assisting the class of 2021 complete and submit college applications. In addition to their one to one support for seniors, the Wingspan staff have facilitated and hosted various workshops including: Creating a UC Account, UC San Diego, San Diego State University and parent workshop explaining the college application process, financial aid, as well as outlining potential expenses for the senior year.

Wingspan sends a weekly newsletter to the senior class which includes scholarship information, virtual office hours and appointment requests and resources.

COVID Facilities Preparedness Measures-

GPA continues to follow local, state, and federal guidelines in sanitizing and disinfecting campus. Our custodial staff has been trained on the use of electrostatic sprayers and frequently uses them to disinfect all hard and porous surfaces in classrooms, offices, restrooms and common areas. We continue to stock our inventory supplies of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including face masks, disposable gloves, face shields, sneeze guards, protective barriers and sanitizing supplies. In addition, we have upgraded all of the HVAC filters and adjusted the air exchange so that each unit is circulating more outside air into the buildings. We are regularly monitoring recommendations from health officials and medical experts to implement the most up-to-date safety protocols.
