Graduation Requirements

Gompers Preparatory Academy graduates are required to earn a minimum of 44 credits, 1 credit for each semester course passed with a "D" or better.

- 6 Semesters Foreign Language
- 4 Semesters Educational and Nutritional Science
- 2 Semesters Visual and Performing Arts

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

Grade Point Average is computed using the below quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Advanced Placement Courses are given an additional point for weighing the GPA.

In addition, GPA ensures all students complete the necessary A-G requirements as outlined by the University of California and California State University systems. Six credits per semester is the maximum course load.
